Knee and Ankle
Replacement Parts





Exactech has issued a recall of polyethylene plastic inserts used in knee and ankle replacements because the plastic could wear prematurely, leading to implant failure requiring revision surgery.

The recalled inserts fit between the metal components in the knee and ankle replacements to cushion the joints. Exactech issued the recall because the insert packaging did not adequately protect the inserts from oxygen exposure, and overtime, oxygen exposure can cause the inserts to degrade.

The recall affects the following knee and ankle replacement systems:

- » Opetrak Logic
- » Truliant
- » Vantage
